**Choose a data base** for your social sciences research topic

Brainstorm keywords & concepts to create a search statement, use synonyms

Then select relevant data bases

#### 1. Academic Search Complete (EBSCO)

**Example:**

**Find: Non governmental and organizations ( SU subject term search) (or select a field optional, Keywords) and  
Limit to format: scholarly (peer reviewed) journals articles and limit  
To published date from Jan 2000 - Dec. 2008**

### **Bibliographic Citations Retrieved: Example**

Parks, Thomas. 2008. The rise and fall of donor funding for advocacy NGOs: understanding the impact. **Development in Practice**. 18 (2): 213-222.

**This citation gives author, article title, journal title, publication date, volume, issue, and page number of journal article.**

This data base also provides for some citations the full online text of this article, click on PDF or HTML to view the text for electronic content. You may also **Mark, email, or print out** citations or full text if available from this data base.

To learn if Development in practice (journal) is in UCSB Libraries, Click **UC-eLinks**, This is full text electronic journal via Informaworld Journals, To learn if **UCSB Libraries** have **print** copies, **Click Check UC Libraries catalogs for a print copy** Select **details/locations** on MELVYL or on right arrow next to it: UCSB Library is listed for journal, Click **details/locations** for the entry, Scroll down to UCSB Library holdings: UCSB Library has this journal in electronic journal format and not in print.

## **2. Public Affairs Information Service/PAIS Data Base**

Use **Advanced** Search tab at top, Sample Search Strategy

Keywords **nongovernmental AND Keywords organizations (in same search box; do not use 'OR' command) and Keyword development**

**Limit to Date from 2000 to 2008, to Journal Articles Only, to**

**English only. Click Search.** Click **View Record** to view Abstracts, Descriptors, and other features, to select relevant journal articles for your research topic.

Record (citations) retrieved 161.

You may also **mark, then click Save, print, email,** citations.

And you may create a Bibliography using **QuikBib** and **Chicago 15 edition** citation Format, in **MS Word** form, and **Save** on flash drive, or **e-mail**; Click **Return to Results** to continue to review selected citations. In this data base, you can also search keywords:

**empirical** or **data** to locate empirical sources of information. (Do **not** Export to RefWorks – UCSB does not have an agreement with this service).

## **3. Social Sciences Citation Index (ISI Web of Science)**

Select **Social Sciences Citation Index**. **Unclick Science Citation Index and Arts & Humanities Citation Index** (delete check in each box). Select dates **2000 to 2008**. In **Search For** box, In **Topic Search**, Type in your **keyword search terms**: example: **nongovernmental and Organizations and development** **Click search button**. You may **Refine: limit to English language** (drop down menu at bottom). **Bibliographic citations** are retrieved. Click on **title** for full citation and abstract.

Click on **Full text available from... or UCeLinks** to learn if UCSB Libraries own this journal. Click on **summary button** to return to brief list of citations. You may **Mark, save, email or print** citations. You may **mark** records and **save to EndNote Web** You may **register and create a free password**. This is a new bibliographic

Management package service on the web for UCSB students & faculty only.

4. **Elsevier ScienceDirect** Select **Journals** Tab and Select **Social Sciences**, then **Search Abstracts, Keywords** example, type: **nongovernmental and organizations and development** and Limit From 1998 to date; click **Search**.

To learn if UCSB Libraries own the journal(s) you are interested in, you may also go to PEGASUS and search by exact title of journal: Journal Title begins with...  
To email citation(s), click in boxes in left column to mark and to select citations.

#### F. To locate journals in UCSB Libraries

**Search in PEGASUS** by Exact Title of Journal

Example:

Journal Title begins with... development policy review

Click on journal title **development policy review**

For some serials/journals, there are several bibliographic records. Material type (format) is Serial. To learn when journal is **print**, a call number is given, click on **library & call number**, such as **Main Library HC 60 .D48** to learn about holdings, circulation, and if checked out, when due to return to Library.

When **Electronic** Journal (internet resource online) is listed, learn what volumes and years are available. You may click on link to full text of journal when our Library subscribes to full text online.

### **Word processing, printing & copying**

**InfoWork Stations**, first floor south near Main Reference collections, have Microsoft word for word processing; bring flash drive. Purchase copy card (\$1 for card, add \$1 to use as debit card, \$.10 per page printed/copied). Purchase copy card at card dispenser on Pillar near Reference & Information Desk; many computers are linked to print release stations. **Place print order, click okay to print charge/deduction, type in your first and last name, go to print release station and type in your first and last name, click okay to print charge, click on your order number next to your name, click on print icon to activate print. Copy machines are located near Main Reference collection, near Reference & Information Desk, first floor south; second floor north; and other selected locations in Davidson Libraries.
