1. Expanded Academic ASAP

Click on **E** for **Expanded Academic**, click on **Expanded Academic**; In **Advanced Search**

Sample Strategy :

Keywords search: **gender AND** (Boolean operator) **Keywords: discrimination**

And **limit to Peer reviewed articles** for scholarly,

Research oriented, and **Limit to Date After: 1 January 1998**

click **Search**. 1403 citations are retrieved. Example: bibliographic

This citation gives authors, date of publication, article title, journal title, volume, and beginning page number of journal article.

This data base may provide an abstract of this article, click on icon with

sheet of paper with A to view a summary/abstract and subjects of journal article. In this

example, A on sheet of paper means abstract with citation only and PDF means full text

electronic journal article. You may also **Mark, email and** or **print out** citations or full text

if available from this data base.

To learn if **Sex roles: a journal of research is in print** in UCSB Libraries, Click **UC-eLinks**. Click name of vendor, i. e. **springer** (electronic journals) and or for a Print Copy, click search **UC MELVYL** to learn if libraries have print copy or may be an **online copy from another vendor**. When **UCSB** is listed next to **Library**, Click **Select details/locations** on MELVYL **Scroll** down to UCSB Library holdings. For Print copies, write down Libraries Call Numbers and Check **Library Locations** brochure <http://www.library.ucsb.edu/help/locguide.pdf> ; Bound journals are shelved with books by call number; recent issues in social sciences and humanities are in Serials and Newspapers Reading room, Davidson Library First floor north.

2. **Sociological Abstracts and Sociology Sage Full Text Collection Data Bases From Articles Indexes & Data Bases**

Select Social Sciences Data Bases via CSA

Select Next to **Change** Click **Specific Data Bases** Check **Sociological Abstracts** and **Sociology: A SAGE Full-Text Collection**, (Uncheck other clicked data bases) Click **Continue to Search**

Use **CSA Illumina Platform** In **Advanced** Search. Sample Search Strategy
Keywords **gender** **AND** Keywords **discrimination** Limit to **Journal Articles Only**, to **English only** and **Limit date to 1998** to date.

Click **View Record** to view Abstracts, Descriptors, and other features, to determine if this is a relevant journal article for your research topic. View record (citation) # **5** of **533** as example:

Haberfeld, Yitchak and Yinon Cohen. 2007. "Gender, ethnic, and national earnings gaps in Israel: The role of rising inequality." *Social Science Research* 36(2):654-672.

Click **UCeLinks** to learn if UCSB Libraries have this journal. Click on that **link** for Electronic journal text or Click On **Find a Print Copy...** Click on **Details/Locations** for the journal entry that lists UCSB Library. **Scroll** down to UCSB Library holdings. For this journal, UCSB Libraries provide both online and print holdings.

You may also **mark** to save, **email**, **print**, or **download** citations. And you may **create** a **Bibliography** using **QuikBib** and **Chicago 15 edition citation** Format and **Ms word** and **Save on disk** or **e-mail**.

3. **Social Sciences Citation Index (Web of Science)**

Select **Social Sciences Citation Index**. Click **Access New Version**, Click **Web of Science Change Limits to Omit Arts & Humanities and Omit Sciences Citation Index** and Select dates **1998 to 2007**. Type your Search strategy Keywords in Topic, Example **gender and discrimination** **1669 documents** (citations) are retrieved. Select citation as example. Click on **title** for full citation and abstract. Click on **UCeLinks** to learn if UCSB Libraries own journals. Click on **summary button** to return to **brief list** of citations. The Libraries have this article in an **electronic journal** only. You may **mark**, **save**, **print** & **email** citations.

You may also conduct a **Cited Reference Search**, for example searching for an author and learning which articles have cited that author's work, such as a journal article. You may mark, Save to EndNote Web , to establish an EndNote Web bibliographic

management system account and

Save and manipulate your bibliographic citations in EndNote Web software.

4. ERIC/Educational Resources Information Center Data Base

Search **Keywords** example, type: **gender** and **discrimination**

limit to journal articles and English and click **Search**. citations are retrieved.

You may also go to PEGASUS and search by exact title of journal: Title begins with...

You may mark, save, print or email citations.

D. To locate journals in UCSB Libraries

Search in PEGASUS by Exact Title of Journal

Example:

Journal Title begins with... industrial and labor relations review

Click on journal title **Industrial and labor relations review**

For some serials/journals, there are several bibliographic records. Material type format is Serial. To learn when journal is **print**, a call number is given, click on **library & call number**, such as **Main Library H 1 .I53** to learn about holdings, circulation, and if checked out, when due to return to Library.

When **Electronic** Journal, an internet resource online, is listed, learn what volumes and years are available. Click on link to full text of journal when our Library subscribes to full text online.
