1. **Expanded Academic ASAP**

Strategy example:

In **Advanced Search**, Create your Search Strategy using Keywords to retrieve relevant bibliographic Journal citations: Sample Search: Select **Keyword** search, type in box: **domestic and** (Boolean operator) **workers** and **poverty** **Limit to date**, click button **After 1 January 1998**, Limit to **Peer reviewed** publications (scholarly), Click **Search; 15 citations** are retrieved. View citations; Select relevant bibliographic citations for your topic. Write down full **bibliographic citation**: including author(s), article title, Journal title, date, volume, issue, and beginning page. Example **eleventh** citation:

Beck, Elizabeth. "The National Domestic Workers Union and the War on Poverty." Journal of Sociology & Social Welfare 28.4 (Dec 2001): 195(17).

You may **mark** citations, **view mark list**, and **print out citations**,

You may also **email marked citations** to your email address, including full text articles when available. View **Abstracts** – gives summary of articles.

View **Text** - you may click on Text to view full text of serials/journals articles when available

Click on **UC-eLinks** to learn if this journal is in UCSB Libraries; for Electronic journal article, click on **Full text icon (sheet of paper with lines)**

To learn if UCSB Libraries own print & other format versions including Electronic, click on **UCeLinks and Search UC MELVYL to learn If Libraries have Print copies**. Click **details/locations** on MELVYL...Scroll down to UC Santa Barbara, and when Libraries have this issue in print, write down Library Call number HM 1 .J69; this Issue is available in Libraries in print form. UCeLinks also indicates this Journal is also an Electronic Journal article (full text).To **email** citation to your Email: **Mark** citation, click **Marked Items** at top left; Click **Email** in Tools box at Left; Type Umail, select Plain text format; Select Citation or Full text if available; Select APA citation format; enter subject line; your email; and comments if chosen; click send. (Note: in Citation Tools/generate a citation, UCSB Libraries do NOT offer Reference Manager or RefWorks Citation management software).

2. **Sociological Abstracts**

Sample search strategy:

In **Advanced Search**, Search **Keywords: gender and discrimination** limit to **journal articles only, English only**; select date: from **1998**; click **Search**. **502** journal articles are retrieved. Click **View record** to view full entry including abstract and descriptors. View Citation number **7** as example. It is available electronically as PDF – click on link. Write down complete citation.

To learn if UCSB Libraries have **this journal in Print**, click on **UC-eLinks or search in UCSB PEGASUS (journal title begins with...)**. You may

print, email or download citations. You may **mark** records, **view marked records, save/print/email records**. From **Save/print/email** records screen for **marked records**, you may use **QuikBib** to **format selected** bibliographic citations into a specific style, such as **Chicago manual of style(15th)** and **click on Create** button. Then you may email or download your Chicago formatted citations for your bibliography. UCSB Libraries have this journal article full text PDF (portable document file) online; it is NOT available as a print journal article.

3. Social Sciences Citation Index (Web of Science) Data Base

Click Access the New Version at top

Sample search strategy

De-select Science citation index and Arts & humanities citation index, uncheck each box; Select time covered: 1998 to date; Click General search button

Search: in **Topic box**, type your **keywords** example: **gender and discrimination**

Click **search** button; **1680 citations** are retrieved. **Click on Title for complete**

reference including abstract and additional information. Select number **13** as example. Write down complete **citation**. **Click UC-eLinks** for availability, online and print holdings.

You may **print out, Email, or download** search results. For this specific citation number **13**, UCSB Libraries have it in print only; current issues of social sciences & humanities journals and magazines are in Serials & Newspapers Reading Room, first floor north(for this journal publisher, it imposed embargo(prevents online full text access most recent 6 months)).

C. To Locate Journals/Periodicals in UCSB Libraries

Search in UCSB PEGASUS Catalog System : Click on **PEGASUS** Catalog; In Basic Search, select **Journal Title begins with...**: Type in exact journal title:

Example: **journal of labor research**; click **Search**; Click on journal of labor **research**, Click on **HD 4802 .J69** For example,

recent issues of this journal are in Serials & Newspapers Reading area, first floor north, with call number given above. Use **Library locations** brochure
