- C. UCSB PEGASUS Catalog System - To locate books and journal holdings
Perform a Basic Keyword search: Brainstorm & explore related keywords and synonyms, and build your search strategy, example:
Keywords search: social and identity
Use “**and**” as Boolean operator to intersect two sets (words); retrieve co-occurring terms.
Select number **10** as example
Journal title begins with...Journal of Ethnic and migration studies
- D. UCSB Libraries Indexes & Data Bases <http://www.library.ucsb.edu/eresources/databases/>
1. Expanded Academic ASAP Data Base
Strategy example:
Create your **Search strategy** in **Advanced Search** using **Keywords** and synonyms. Select **Keyword** search and type: **society and identity**
Use **AND** as Boolean operator which retrieves results of Intersection of two terms (sets). To limit by date, select **After** and select 1 January 1997. Limit to **peer reviewed Publications**/Journal articles, that are Scholarly/research oriented. Click **Search button**; **1205 citations** are retrieved.
View citations; Select relevant bibliographic citations for your topic. Write down complete **bibliographic citation**: Example: **third** citation listed :
Horenczyk, Gabriel, Munayer, Salim J. (Jan 2007) Acculturation orientations toward two majority groups: the case of Palestinian Arab Christian adolescents in Israel. **Journal of Cross-Cultural Psychology**, 38, p76(11).
You may **mark, view mark list,** and **print out citations from top links,**
You may also **email marked citations** to your email address, including full text articles when available. View **Abstracts** – gives summary of articles. You may also use **How to Cite Marked Items** for your bibliography. To **mail**, type your email address, select **Plain Text**, select **Citation** (or full text when available), select **APA** (or **MLA**), click **Send**. (UCSB does NOT subscribe to Endnote, ProCite, Reference Manager bibliographic management software). View **Text** - you may click on Text to view full text of journals/serials articles when available.
Click on **UC-eLinks** to find if UCSB Libraries own this journal, i. E. journal of Cross cultural psychology ; **Full text available** from **CSA Sage Psychology**
Or you may Click on **See if a UC campus has this...**click on **Details/**
/Locations to learn if UCSB Libraries have volume, year of Journal/
serial that you need. When Libraries Own Print volumes, **Write down** Library **call number:** check to confirm that Libraries have exact volume and issue

you need; For Print volumes, Use **Library Locations** salmon brochure and write down library location. Journal may be in **print** and or **electronic (online)** format . For this 2007 year for this specific Journal, Journal of cross cultural psychology, Libraries have **Electronic Journal article Only**, Not print.

2. Sociological Abstracts Data Base via CSA

Sample strategy: In **Advanced Search**, Search **Keywords: society and identity and keywords and United and states** , limit to **journal articles only, English only**; select date: **from 1997 to 2007** ; click **Search** button. **148** citations (records) are retrieved. Click on **View Record** for abstract, descriptors, and other valuable descriptions of the journal articles. Read citations and abstracts when available to select relevant citations. View Citation **# 1** as example:

Christou, Anastasia. 2006. American dreams and european nightmares: Experiences and polemics of second-generation greek-american returning migrants. *Journal of Ethnic and Migration Studies* 32, (5) (July): 831-845

To find if UCSB Libraries have this **journal of ethnic and migration studies**, click on **UC-eLinks**. You may choose **print copy** of journal in UC Calif. Digital Library MELVYL Data Base library call number **HN 381 .N45** . Recent issues are in **Serials and Newspapers Reading Room**, Davidson Library **first floor north**. Note: **Electronic copy** may also be available. You may **print** out, **email** or **download** citations.

Mark Selected records. After clicking **Save,Print,Email**, you may **create a Bibliography** using **QuikBib** and **Chicago 15 edition** in **MS word** format and Email, Print or Save on a flash Drive. (The Export to RefWorks option is not available in UCSB Libraries).

E. To Locate Journals/Serials in UCSB Libraries

Search in UCSB PEGASUS Catalog System : Click on **PEGASUS** Catalog; Click **Search PEGASUS**. In **Basic Search** of Full Catalog, select Search Type **Journal Title begins with...**: Type in exact title of journal/serial: Example: **journal of ethnic and migration studies** click **Search**; Click on **journal of ethnic and migration studies**; Click on **Main Library HN 381 .N45** to view holdings. For example Vol. 32, issue number 5 (2006) is a recent issue. Use **Library Locations** brochure to learn where recent issues and bound serials/ periodicals are in UCSB Libraries. This specific recent issue (social sciences & humanities) is in Serials & Newspapers reading room, first floor north.

F. Use **UCSB Off Campus Access : Libraries Proxy Server or VPN**: For Remote access to UCSB Libraries Data Bases and electronic journals for UCSB students, faculty, and staff only. <http://www.library.ucsb.edu/help/offcampus.html> Students use UCSBnetID (Umail),password.
