Open Access is

Scholarly materials that are available free online, with little or no copyright restrictions.

Two ways to make literature open access:

- Publishing in an open access journal or
- Depositing an article in an open access repository, the UC OA Policy way



1. Scope of the UC OA Policy

- A publication agreement between Senate faculty and UC
- Articles with publication agreements signed after 7/24/13
- Expects faculty to deposit the final post peer review author's manuscript version of articles in eScholarship
- Waivers (opting out) and embargoes (delayed access) available



2. Rights Retained Under the Policy

UC authors retain the rights to their published articles:

- To reuse/reproduce without permission from the publisher
- To distribute, deposit in an OA repository, or post on a personal website
- To authorize others to exercise any of these rights



3. Policy Goal

- To ensure UC authors retain the rights to their work
- To facilitate wider dissemination of UC scholarship
- To provide free public access to UC research



4. Publishers Have Been Notified

- None have informed UC that they will request waivers as a blanket policy for UC
- All contacted publishers are listed on the Policy website
- Author rights will continue to be written into licensing agreements



5. It's OK to Sign Publisher Agreements*

- The UC Policy prevails over publisher copyright transfer agreements (7/24/13)
- Faculty can rely on the Policy for the right to share/reuse their work as long as they don't get an official waiver



6. UC Publication Management System Makes it Easy

- Automated harvesting of UC authored publications
- Manual upload of publication information
- Manage all your publications in one place
- Journal rankings and citation counts
- Altmetrics: share, tweets, news outlets' coverage
- Generate a full or custom CV
- Sort publications by date, title, type






8A. Not All Publication Info Will Be Located
