Marvin Miller Collection

Introduction

The Marvin E. Miller Collection of the American Radio Archives at the Thousand Oaks Library consists of the papers and sound recordings which document the life and career of radio and television announcer and actor Miller. The collection begins chronologically with Miller's earliest work on radio in 1931, concluding with scripts of programs recorded in the years before his death in 1985.

Biography

Radio actor Marvin Miller was born Marvin Elliott Mueller in St. Louis, Missouri on July 18, 1913. He changed his last name to Miller in 1945, tired of hearing it frequently mispronounced, matched the spelling to the way he had always pronounced it.

As a child, Miller was interested in journalism, and during the summers of his high school years, he worked in the office of the *St. Louis Times*, hoping to gain experience that would benefit him later. After high school, he attended Washington University in St. Louis on a scholarship. According to a later CBS biography of Miller, the stock market crash of 1929 as well as the merger of the *Times* with another newspaper, the *Star*, made his dream of pursuing a career in journalism more difficult, due to the large number of journalists seeking employment after these two events. This, coupled with the loss of his scholarship due to the Great Depression, led Miller to look for paid employment elsewhere, which turned out to be radio station KWK in St. Louis. Miller applied for a job as an announcer at the station in 1931, but was rejected for being too young. He asked if there were any other jobs that he could perform for the station, and was soon writing and starring in a local program, *The Adventures of Lord Algy*, for which he was paid five dollars a week. This new work, and the income it provided, enabled him to return to Washington University, where he completed his bachelor's degree in 1934.

In 1932, Miller was hired at CBS affiliate KMOX in St. Louis, where he remained for the next seven years, first working as a staff announcer, and then being promoted to the position of assistant chief announcer in 1936. During this time, he continued to work as a writer, actor, and announcer for the station, soon building a

reputation for his versatility, his ability to perform multiple roles and voices in a program, and his accurate pronunciation of foreign names and phrases. In interviews, he fondly remembered such KMOX programs as *The Cruise of the Poll Parrot*, a children's series which took place on a pirate ship, or *The Old Scoutmaster*, in which he performed the role of the 65 year-old title character as well as that of "Montgomery Mouse." Miller's lifelong interest in poetry also found its way into his early programs, as he hosted several series of poetry readings, such as *Treasure Chest*, *The Strolling Bard*, and *Crazy Water Crystals* (the name of the sponsor).

In 1938 Miller married Elizabeth Dawson, and soon thereafter began looking for a larger stage on which to ply his trade. In the spring of 1939, the Millers moved to Chicago. When he was unable to find work as an announcer, he applied for acting jobs, and gradually found his services in both areas in greater demand. Before long, Miller was working as an announcer on programs such as *Ma Perkins*, *The Quiz Kids*, *The Guiding Light*, and *Vic and Sade*, among a host of others. He also obtained acting roles in programs such as *The Romance of Helen Trent*, in which he played the role of Gil Whitney for five years; *Chicago Theatre of the Air*; *Peter Quill*, in which he played the title role; and many other programs. During World War II he enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve, performing in Coast Guard broadcasts from Chicago such as *On Guard with the Coast Guard*. By 1944, Miller was working on 45 programs per week. In one fan magazine interview, he claimed that this frenetic pace of work led him to spend so little time with his family, that his four-year old son Anthony didn't recognize him. This and the need to find a better climate for his son's health, led him to consider a move to Hollywood. In April 1945, the Millers moved to Hollywood, where Marvin found work on new programs such as *The Red Skelton Show* and *The Billie Burke Show*, and where he also brought at least one Chicago program, the *Coronet Story Teller*, with him.

In Hollywood, the pace of Miller's work soon caught up to the level of his Chicago years, as he added acting roles in feature films to his already lengthy radio resume. One of the best known radio programs associated with Miller's name during this time is *The Whistler*, on which he initially served as the announcer, but later added the lead role, when Bill Forman, the original Whistler, was drafted into the Army. During the years in Hollywood, however, Miller also continued to work on two favorite types of radio program, poetic readings, and factual, historical vignettes. His abiding interest in poetry resurfaced in programs such as *Moon Dreams* (syndicated, 1946), and *Words with Music*, which started a lengthy association between Miller and the Armed Forces Radio Service. In 1949, he began working on a program for the Mutual Broadcasting System titled *Behind the Story*, a daily 15-minute program that provided peeks behind well-known historical events. Even though the bulk of this show's nine-year run was broadcast over Mutual's regional Don Lee Network, it proved to be an enduring favorite among listeners. When Mutual cancelled the program in 1958, Miller continued it under the name *Marvin Miller, Storyteller* for CBS affiliate KNX in Los Angeles.

The 1950s also saw Miller expand his acting repertoire to include television programs, and throughout the remainder of his career he appeared as a character actor on numerous programs. The series for which Miller is best remembered, however, is Don Fedderson's *The Millionaire* (CBS, 1955-1960). On this program, Miller played the role of J. Michael Anthony, the assistant to a reclusive billionaire who at the beginning of each episode gave away a check for \$1 million to a lucky but unsuspecting individual. Miller's character delivered the check to that person, and the remainder of each episode detailed how this radical change in their fortunes affected the rest of their lives. Miller became so well-known as Anthony, that he made countless celebrity

appearances over the next decade at the openings of new businesses, especially banks. At such appearances, Miller often handed out checks made out for "a million dollars (worth) of good luck." Fans of this program sometimes found it hard to separate fact from fiction, and in some cases wrote to Miller asking for money. In many cases, though, they simply wrote to express their admiration for the program, and Miller often wrote back asking for snapshots of these fans for a scrapbook that he maintained.

With the decline in network radio, Miller sought additional venues for his acting and announcing skills, and soon became a sought-after voice over artist, working on numerous commercials, film trailers, company training films, and recordings. During this period, Miller received a Grammy award for his recording of stories by Dr. Seuss, and he also recorded audio versions of the Bible and a number of novels for Audio Books. Miller rounded out his activities during this period by appearing in local theatrical productions in cities around the United States. Miller died on February 8, 1985 in Santa Monica, California.

Scope and Content

The Marvin Miller Collection encompasses the years 1931-1985, with the bulk of the material dating from approximately 1935-1970. The collection is divided into three main categories, those being correspondence, scripts and screenplays, and sound recordings. The correspondence includes fan mail, business and membership letters, material relating to publicity and personal appearances, as well as personal and family correspondence.

Among the scripts are radio programs, divided by their area of broadcast origin: St. Louis, Chicago, and Hollywood. The bulk of the Hollywood scripts are for the series *Behind the Story*. The television scripts are divided into programs on which Miller occasionally appeared and scripts from *The Millionaire*. The remaining scripts include screenplays of movies, both feature films and company training or documentary films, and miscellaneous scripts (e.g., unidentified, presentation scripts, theatrical scripts, etc.

The sound recordings that have been processed include 44 hours of radio programming, 7 hours of interviews, and several hours of miscellaneous programming, which includes narrations for films, commercials, film trailers, excerpts from audio books, and pilot recordings.

Additional material include 4 yearbooks from Washington University from the years of Miller's attendance there (1930-1934), as well as 6 scrapbooks clippings and photographs that document Miller's radio, television and film work; as well as his personal appearances, and one book with photographs of fans who wrote to him.
