### Phil Rapp Collection

Philip Rapp (1907-1996) was an award-winning writer, director and producer, and the man behind the popular and long-running radio series *The Bickersons*. He wrote for comedians such as Ben Blue, Don Ameche, Eddie Cantor, Joan Davis, Joe E. Brown and Frank Morgan. He also created the Baby Snooks character for Fanny Brice of the Ziegfeld Follies. He wrote six movies for Danny Kaye and directed and produced several TV series, including *Topper* and *The Adventures of Hiram Holiday*
